<b>MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION COMMITTEE</b>	Participants read applications submitted and score applicants based on a rubric. Organizations applying for Option 3 status for additional schools may not join this sub-committee. Given the time commitment to review applications, a small school stipend will be provided for participation.	<b>December-January</b>
<b>MEMBERSHIP INTERVIEW COMMITTEE</b>	Participants serve as interview panelists for schools applying to Option 3. Organizations applying for Option 3 status for additional schools may not join this sub-committee. Given the time commitment to interview applicants, a small school stipend will be provided for participation.	<b>December</b>
<b>PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT GRANT COMMITTEE</b>	Participants read grant applications and recommend new grant funding to support the development or expansion of high-quality and impactful mild/moderate or moderate/severe programs. Given the time commitment to review applications and to evaluate presentations, a small school stipend will be provided for participation.	<b>December-January</b>
<b>INNOVATION GRANT COMMITTEE</b>	Participants read grant applications and recommend grant funding to seed innovative professional development, research and development, student experiences and/or resources. Given the time commitment to review applications, a small school stipend will be provided for participation.	<b>December-January</b>
<b>SCHOOL COLLABORATION COMMITTEE</b> (NEW COMMITTEE!)	Participants gather school-based feedback on sector-wide trainings and supports, plans professional development sessions during Coordinating Council meetings and provides mentorship to new Option 3 schools. Given the time commitment for this committee, a small school stipend will be provided for participation.	<b>Varies</b>
<b>NONVIOLENT CRISIS INTERVENTION TRAINING COMMITTEE</b> (NEW COMMITTEE!)	Participants are trained in Crisis Prevention Institute's Nonviolent Crisis Intervention and lead up to two community training opportunities for Option 3 schools. This committee replaces the previous B-SET Committee. Given the time commitment for this committee, a small school stipend will be provided for participation.	<b>Varies</b>

<sup>1</sup> All Option 3 schools need to participate on at least one committee, however, schools within a network of schools only need to participate on one committee. A committee participant can be someone from an Option 3 Council or another staff member that expresses an interest to be involved with Option 3 decision-making. Current charter schools that participate on the Option 3 Executive Board and/or participate on the Director's Advisory Committee fulfill their Option 3 committee requirement.
