	Consult Team: Behavior	Access to behavior support staff for interim placements, manifestation determinations, FBA/BSP/BIPs, suspensions/expulsions, technical guidance/consultation and trainings		
	Consult Team: Mental Health	Access to mental health support staff for crisis situations, bereavement support, professional development and technical guidance		
	Division of Special Education Supports	Access to support staff for consultation on informal dispute resolution, due process, non-public schools, private schools and residential treatment centers		
	Technical Assistance	Timely response to special education questions and concerns		
	Compliance Supports	Access to staff support for DVR assistance, state-level action plans for special education, resources, training and technical guidance on building a compliant special education program		
	Low Incidence Materials	Access to funds to provide specialized books, materials and equipment as required under the IEP for a student with low incidence disability		
	Fee-for-Service	Access to services, as available: Extended School Year, related service providers and placements		
	Speciality Consultant Supports	Access to speciality consultant support focused on: English Language Develop for students with disabilities, informal dispute resolution, moderate/severe needs and psychological supports		
	Newsletters	Subscription to special education newsletters that focus on legal topics, IEP team development and special educators		
	Assessment Library	Access to special education assessments

	Grant: Program Development	Access to apply for funding to support the development or expansion of high-quality and impactful mild/moderate or moderate/severe special education programs		
	Grant: Innovation	Access to apply for funding to offset costs of innovative student experiences, professional development and/or research and development activities in special education		
	Financial Assistance: Tiered Eligibility Allocation	Access to financial assistance, based on a tiered eligibility formula, to build and maintain special education programs, supports and services		
	Financial Assistance: Extraordinary Cost	Access to apply for financial assistance for up to a one-time unexpected nonpublic school placement and/or new nonpublic agency contract for up to \$25,000		
	Financial Assistance: Legal Cost	Access to apply for financial assistance to fund extraordinary one-time costs associated with special education legal action (category qualifications will be modified in the 2022-23 school year)		
PROGRAM OPTIONS	Career and Transition Centers*	Access to Career and Transition Centers, which provide employment preparation, independent living skills and social skills instruction to students ages 18-22 who are on an alternate curriculum		
	Carlson Home Hospital School*	Access to instruction in the home or hospital, which is provided as a temporary service for eligible students whose temporary medical or psychiatric illness prevents them from attending their school of attendance		
	District Placement*	Access to an LAUSD option for placement		
	Interim Placement*	LAUSD provides an interim placement during the expulsion process, if an MOU has been signed		
	Nonpublic School*	If a nonpublic school is recommended by an IEP team, the placement is supported by LAUSD		
	Residential Treatment Center*	If a residential treatment center is recommended by an IEP team, the placement is supported by LAUSD		
	School-Based Special Education Staff	School site special education staffing		
TRAININGS	Option 3 Trainings	Specialized workshops and trainings throughout the school year		
	Special Education Leader Fellowship	Financial assistance to access to the LA and national special education leader fellowship		
	Crisis Intervention	Access to nonviolent crisis intervention training, through the Option 3 community of schools, which provides school site staff with the skills for prevention, minimization and management of challenging behavior		
	LAUSD Trainings	Access to LAUSD trainings through MyPLN
