	<b>Residential Treatment Center*</b>	If a residential treatment center is recommended by an IEP team, the placement is supported by LAUSD. LAUSD provides a residential treatment center, if an MOU has been signed.	✓	✓	✓

## FUNDING OVERVIEW

- LAUSD withholds all special education revenue
- School pays LAUSD fair share contribution (25-35%) based on general fund contribution rate for special education
- School receives 100% of special education revenue
- School pays LAUSD fair share contribution (20-35%) based on general fund contribution rate for special education
- School receives 80% of special education revenue
- Remaining 20% of special education revenue is allocated for Charter Operated Programs' budget and LAUSD fair share contribution
